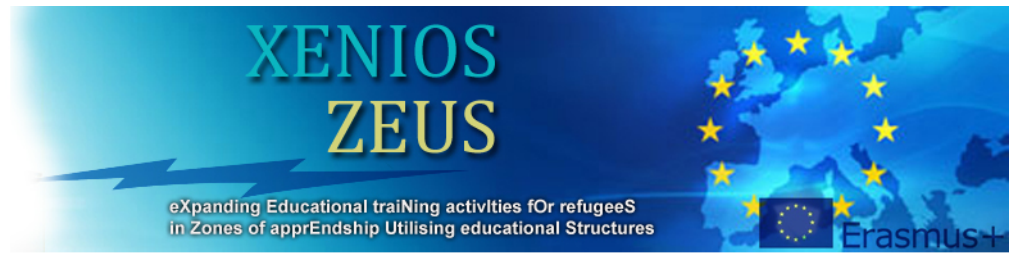

In France, education is free. It is mandatory from the age of six.

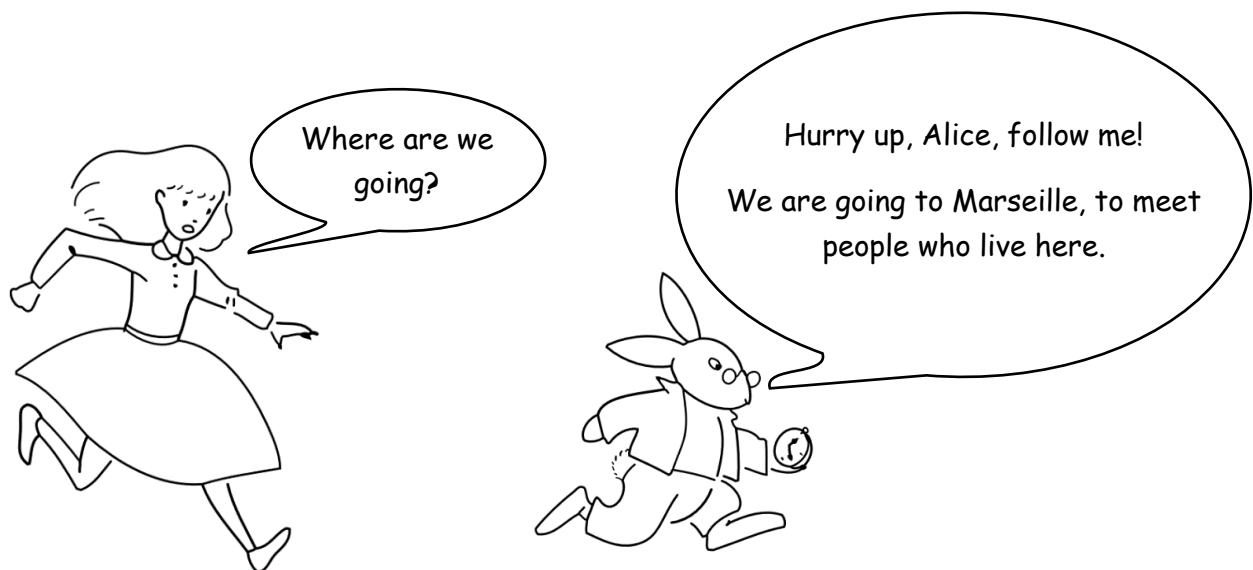

France is a European country. It has land borders with Belgium, Luxembourg, Germany, Switzerland, Italy and Spain.

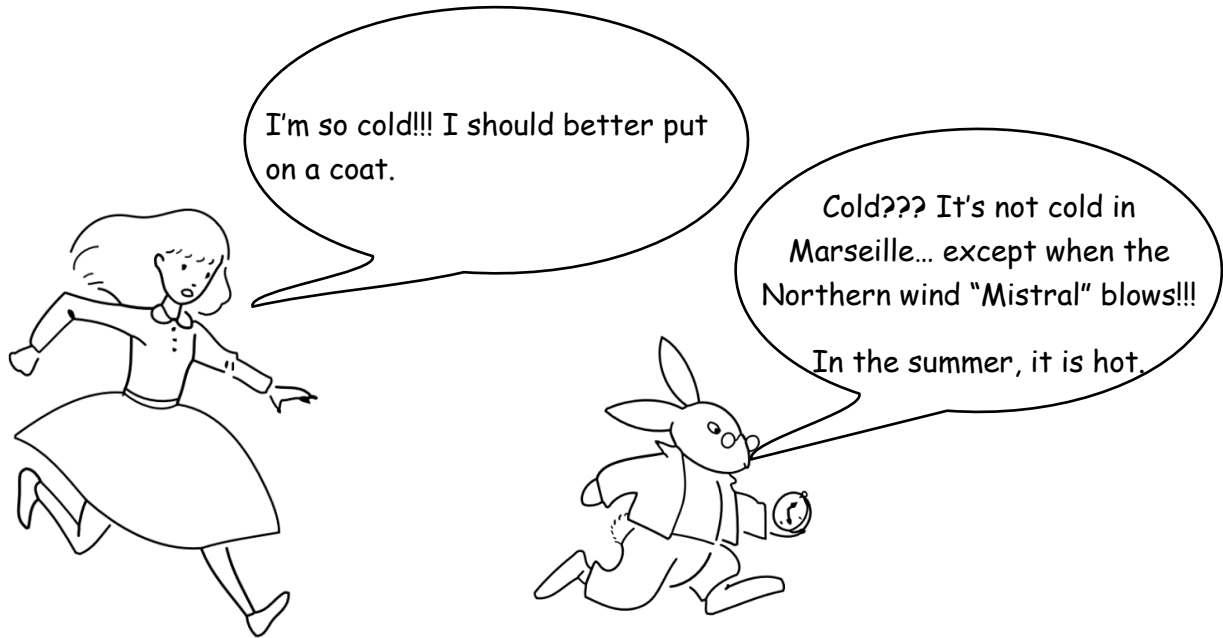

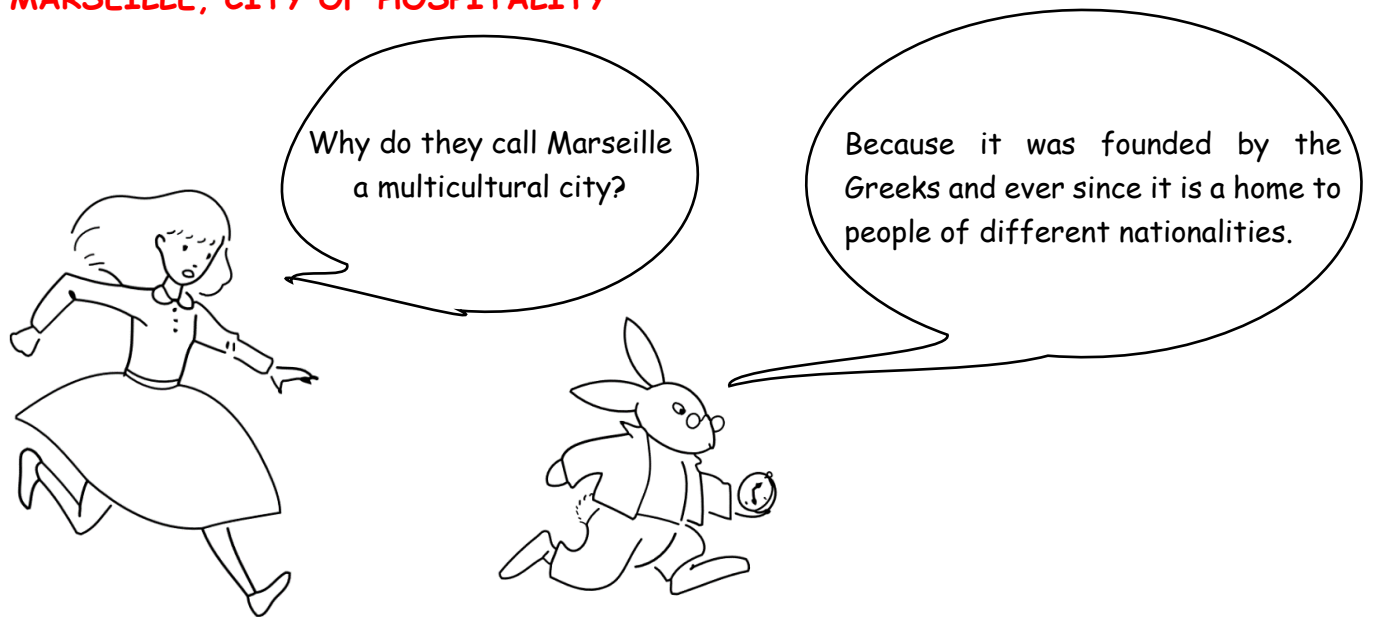

The sailors recognize Marseille by its « Notre Dame de la Garde ».



The inhabitants of Marseille call this basilica *The good mother*.



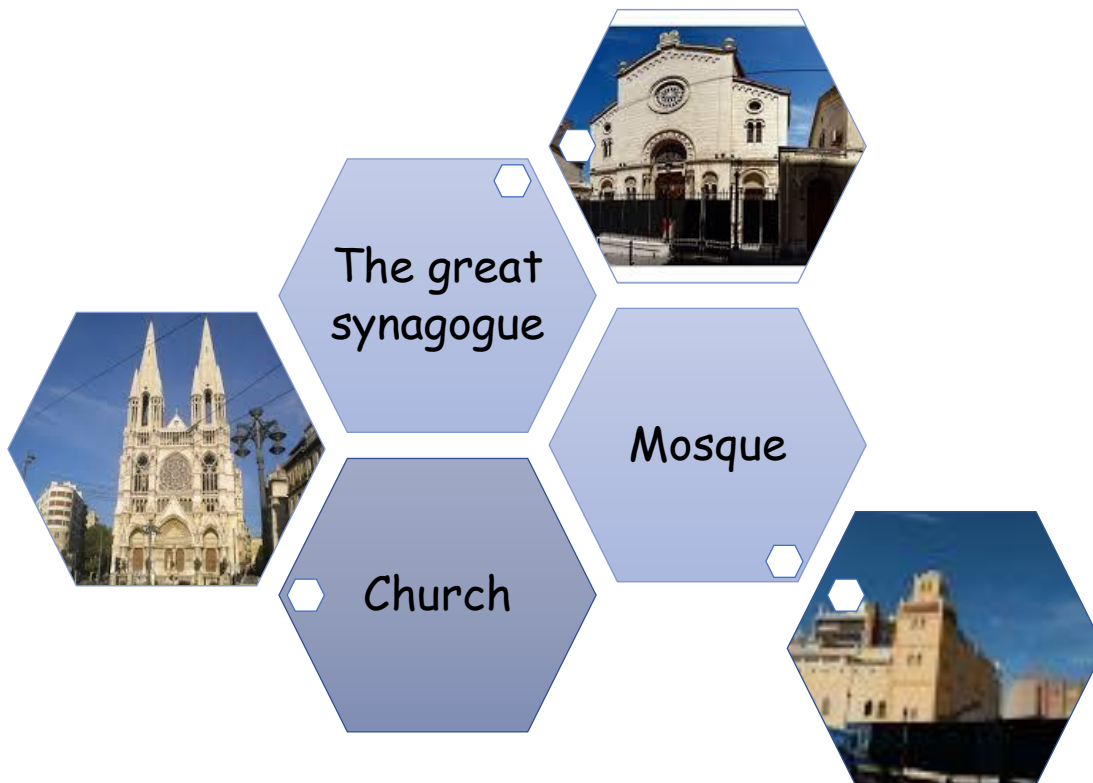
The town hall is located alongshore of the Old Port.

MARSEILLE, AN INTERNATIONAL CITY

- Khalid Ibn al Walid mosque (near the Marché soleil) for Muslims.

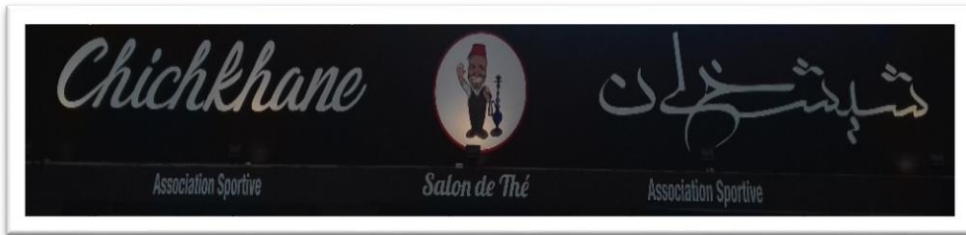

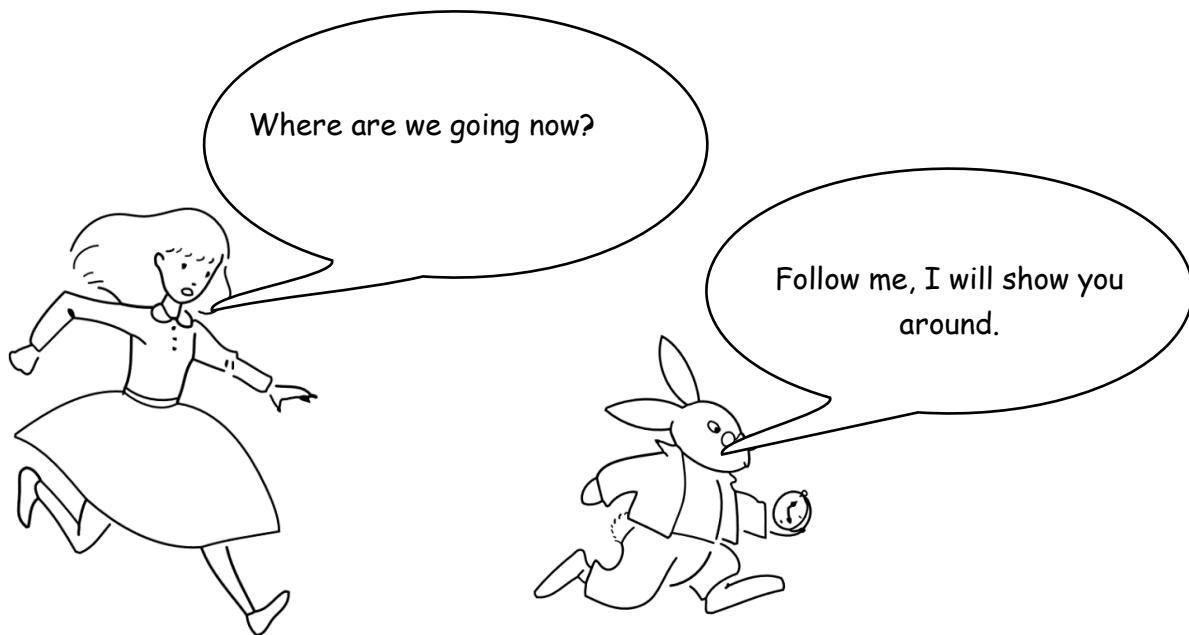

The bouillabaisse : « don't let it boil ! »



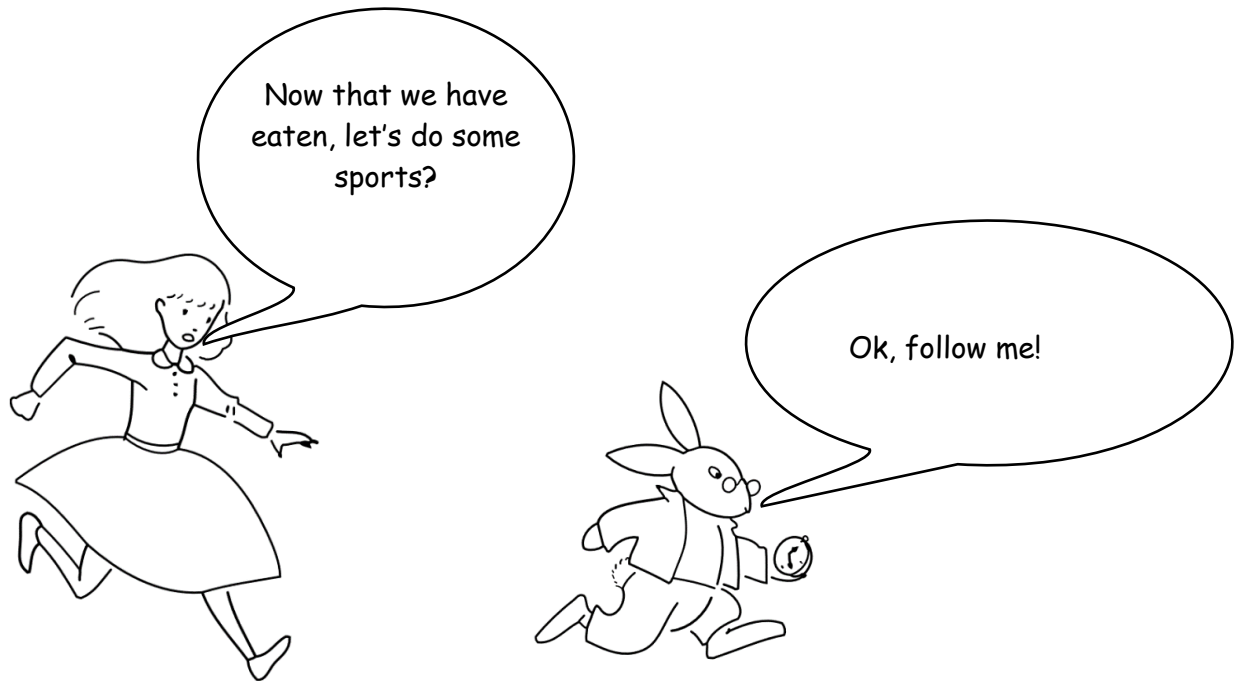
The bouillabaisse is a fish dish. In the past, it used to be called the "soup of the poor" because it was made with the rockfish that could not be sold. It stayed at the bottom of the fishermen's bags after returning from fishing in rocky inlets, between Marseille and Toulon.

Alcazar is the biggest public library in Marseille (in the 1st district)

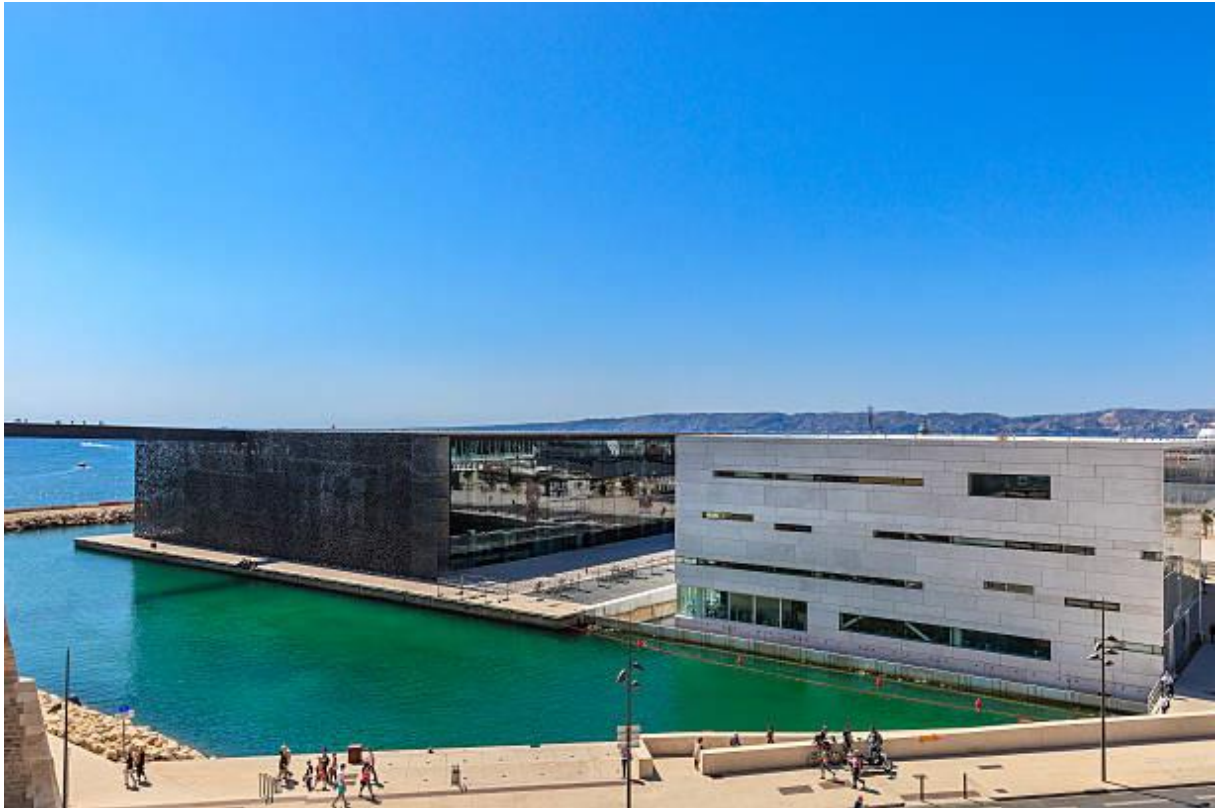

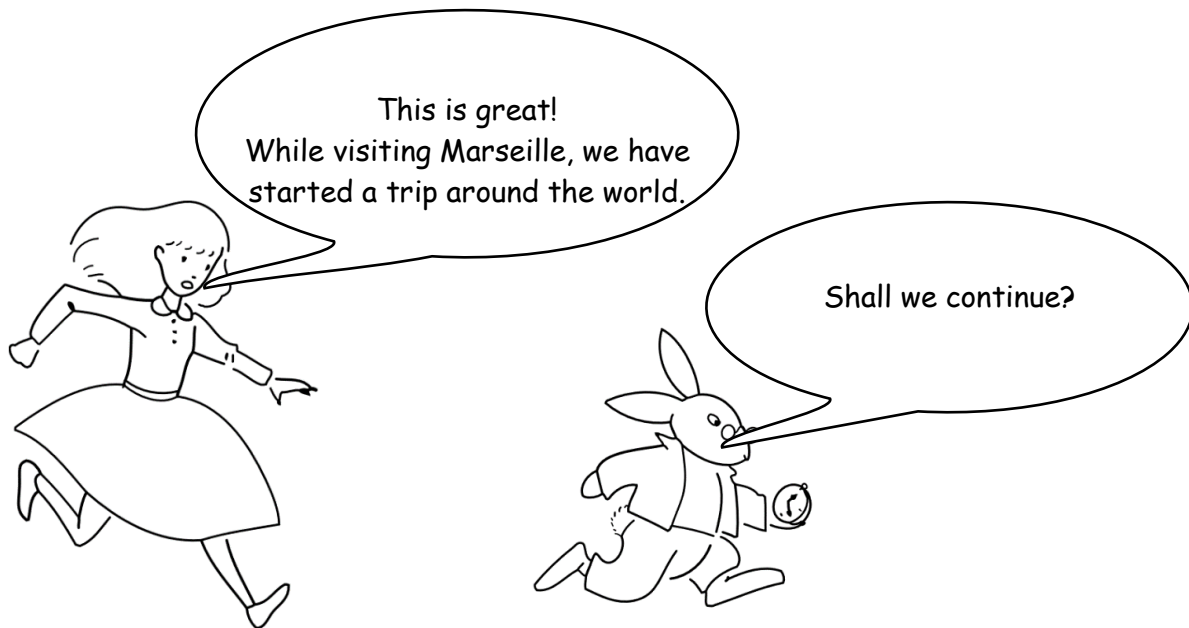
DIVERSITY OF CIVILISATIONS
